[HB 1293](#) [Hoskins-121](#) Adds professional therapy dog to the definition of "service dog" as it relates to crimes against these animals or crimes of impersonating a disabled person.

[HB 1296](#) [Lampe](#) Changes the laws regarding the identification, assessment, and education of children with autism spectrum disorder.

[HB 2010](#) [Icet](#) Appropriates money for the expenses, grants, refunds, and distributions of the Department of Mental Health, Board of Public Buildings, and Department of Health and Senior Services.

[HB 2079](#) [Low](#) Establishes the Paid Sick Days Act which requires employers to provide sick days with pay to employees.

[HB 2105](#) [Curls](#) Allows mental health patients, residents, or clients who receive state-funded care or services to have their cases managed by a qualified case worker employed by the state.

Remarks: 2/26 SUBJECT: The GOOD DMH Case Managers: as we continue to fight against the transformation of services moving to SB-40 boards, there is now HB 2105 sponsored by 8 House Representatives that will propose the State offer to consumers case management services every County by a bona fide State-employed Case Manager. This insures you have a choice.

Here is a question to ask yourself: If all the cases go to the counties, what happens to the Parent Advisory Committee for the Northwest Autism Project? If all the cases go to the counties, but the 1 million dollars of funding is still at KCRO, how will your case managers really know what is going on? Will this improve the flow of information, or could it completely block knowledge, slow down processes, and even more afford favoritism in the administration of monies?

These Legislative fights need the support from you, if this is something you believe is needed for parents and individuals with autism and developmental disabilities.

[HB 2306](#) [Guest](#) Requires the Department of Mental Health to develop a plan for the transitioning of residents of developmental disabilities facilities to the most appropriate settings.

[HJR 67](#) [Pratt](#) Proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing an exemption from property tax on all real and personal property of any citizen of

the state who is 65 years of age or older.
